

Sport Premium Impact Statement 2017-18

Mawgan-in-Pydar's Vision Statement:

Our vision for PE at Mawgan-in-Pydar is to provide:

High quality teaching and learning across the school in all sports and physical activities.

Children with a good understanding of health, hygiene and fitness and a desire to continually improve.

A range of extra-curricular activities and sports clubs which will give all pupils the opportunity to engage with sport.

Sports competition for all levels and abilities in a safe and secure environment.

Key achievements to date:	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:
 Increased participation in competitive sports for all children A wider range of sports and opportunities given to children during their PE sessions Increased focus on sports and healthy lifestyles in general. Provision improved for children to make use of our natural surroundings and thus an increase in physical activity and mental wellbeing. 	 Increase staff expertise and confidence when teaching PE by attending additional training provided by membership of YST and working alongside a TA who is a specialist in sport and PE. Further develop our ability to maximise our use of space when teaching PE to improve the outcome for all pupils. Continue to encourage more participation in competition for all pupils across both key stages and to increase the profile of physical exercise and sports outside of school. Continue to offer a broad range of activities as part of the PE and School sport provision.

Swimming and Water Safety:

At Mawgan-in-Pydar School we are committed to providing a thorough approach to ensuring that all children are proficient and confident swimmers over a distance of at least 25m. If children have not met this standard by the end of year 4, they are required to continue their swimming provision until this standard is met. In addition to this, and due to the coastal nature of the locality, we also utilise the RNLI's 'Hit The Surf' Beach/ Water safety sessions on a regular basis.

Impact statement following the Primary PE and Sport Premium Funding 2017 - 2018:

The whole school community agrees that PE and School Sport can lead to better learners. By ensuring a broad PE curriculum we will be more likely to achieve a greater number of successful learners. All the teaching staff at Mawgan-in-Pydar recognise the importance of PE and how it is integral to our school ethos.

The allocation for our school for the academic year 2017-2018 was £17,340.

Area of	Cost	Impact
Provision Newquay Sports Partnership Funding (NSP)	£2000	Sustaining current participation with the Newquay Sports Partnership sporting events. The impact of this partnership raised participation levels and engaged as many pupils from a wide age range in sport. Without this there would not have been such high participation in competition and sporting events. It also provided courses to upskill staff in
		delivery of the PE curriculum, creating a sustainable PE provision for the future.

Aspire Academy Trust	£700	Provided further sports participation of Aspire games and tournaments, allowed children further access to competitive sports. Youth Sports Trust membership enabled 2 CPD sessions for staff: gymnastics and teaching English through PE.
Transportation to competition	£3000	This enabled a broader range of children to access a full and thorough competitive sports programme. This allocation of funding was essential to enable greater competitive opportunities all children throughout the school.
Replenishing and adding to Sports equipment	£2000	The replenished equipment and improved storage facilities have improved the children's experience of physical education, with enough resources to be used by a whole class, thus keeping them physically active for a sustained period of time. This in turn has led to improved focus in the lessons that follow PE.
Provision of additional opportunities through a wide and varied extra curricular sporting clubs.	£1800	This provided a range of sporting activities for pupils, benefitting children by providing a range of activity in an inclusive manner.
Promotion of intra-school competition.	£900	Purchasing coloured vests in a range of sizes to ensured intra school competition took place for all ages. In conjunction with a higher 'House Team' profile, this further promoted the children's understanding of competition and the benefits of teamwork. A greater emphasis on inter house competition within the school has led to increased self-confidence, determination and leadership skills.
Subsidising funding for Swimming	£1000	Made the delivery of quality swimming teaching more accessible for parents.
Wider Opportunities - surfing	£1300	Continuation of a surfing provision for Year 6. This made the most of our location and provided an opportunity to promote and deliver the principles of water safety for our young people as well as promoting sport and a healthy, active lifestyle.

Monitoring and Assessment of the PE curriculum.	£300	Ensured high quality PE provision for all children as well as supporting staff to deliver the PE curriculum effectively.
CPD and Staff training - Outdoor and Adventurous activities	£1500	Ensured the potential use for our natural surroundings and opportunities for outdoor learning are maximised. Promoted a healthy active lifestyle for children.
Develop the concept of Mawgan in Pydar as a 'Walking School.'	£2340	The structure of a 'Walking School' was developed and trails can be planned. Purchased all weather clothing for children to be properly equipped for the conditions. The scheme maximised use of the school's natural surroundings; promoted healthy active lifestyles and provided wider opportunities to engage children in physical activity. This promoted the health and wellbeing of our children.
Replacing and relocating PE storage	£500	Maximised outdoor space for PE and sport and ensured that PE equipment was easy to access and properly maintained.
